Brunei Darussalam National Championship

Rules and Regulations

1 Organiser

- 1.1 Bandar Seri Begawan 120 (BSB120) is a Brunei Darussalam one day cycling race event which is part of the Brunei Darussalam National Championship for cycling organised by Brunei Darussalam Cycling Federation (BDCF) and Department of Youth and Sports, Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports.

2 Day and date

- 2.1 Date: Sunday 22 August 2021, flagoff at 7.00am

3 Venue

- 3.1 Starting and finishing venue: Stadium Negara Hassanal Bolkiah
- 3.2 Route is 120km and 90km (depending on category). Route will be published on BDCF official FB page.

4 Categories and age

4.1 **120km**

- Elite Roadbike (Age 23-34, born 1998 to 1987)
Under 23 Roadbike (Age 19-22, born 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002)
Master Roadbike (Age 35-50, born 1986 to 1971)

4.2 **90km**

- Veteran Roadbike (Age 51 and above, born 1970 and older)
Junior Roadbike (Age 18 and below, born 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007)
Woman Roadbike (Open, born 2006 and older)
Challenge Roadbike (Non-competitive)
Men Open Mountain Bike (Born 2006 and older)
Women Open Mountain Bike (Born 2006 and older)

- 4.3 The challenge roadbike category is non competitive and no prize will be awarded.

5 Eligibility

- 5.1 Open to Bruneian, residents of Brunei Darussalam and teams.
- 5.2 Age is determined by the present year minus the year of birth of competitor.
Example, 2020 minus 1996 is 24 years old.

6 Registration fee

- 6.1 Individual - BND \$60
- 6.2 Team - BND \$150 per team
- 6.3 All registration fees are non-refundable.
- 6.4 Race kit provided is subject to availability. Race pack contents (Revised 2021):

BSB120 Finisher's Medal
Rental of race transponder
Bib number

7 UCI Licence

- 7.1 All riders are required to have a valid UCI License during the event, which can be acquired from BDCF.
- 7.2 UCI License issued by Brunei Darussalam Cycling Federation:
 - UCI ANNUAL License and Federation Membership \$30 (valid from 1 January 2020 to 31 December 2021). Riders may apply for UCI Annual License by visiting <https://bruneicycling.org/>
 - UCI ONE DAY License and Federation Membership \$20 (valid on race day only and include one day insurance). This license is available for purchase only during Race Kit Collection Day or Pre-Race briefing.
- 7.3 As per UCI regulations and requirements, all applicants for UCI License must have and be covered by an insurance policy.
- 7.4 The following categories do not require insurance coverage to obtain a UCI License:
Commissaire, Doping Control Officer, Federation Executive Committee, Event Organiser, Team Staff, Technical Delegate, Media

Compulsory attendance for all Team Managers

10.4 Jersey and license check for teams will be done before the Team Managers Meeting. Team Managers are to ensure all licenses and team jerseys are presented to Commissaire. Individual riders **are not allowed** to use team jersey.

10.5 For riders who wish to appoint a representative to collect the race kit on behalf, rider's UCI license and proof of registration payment must be presented to the organiser.

10.6 There will be **NO race kit collection or license check** on race day.

11 General Rules and Regulation

- 11.1 The tournament will be conducted in accordance with the rules imposed by the UCI (Union Cyclist International) and local regulations and rules set by the Brunei Darussalam Cycling Federation (BDCF). All riders and especially Team Managers are to familiarise themselves with the regulations and to refer to UCI Cycling Regulations - Part 2 Road Races, UCI Cycling regulations - Part 1 General Organisation of Cycling as a sport and UCI Cycling Regulations - Part 12 Discipline and Procedures.
- 11.2 Any decision issued by the Commissaire Panel is final. However, protest may be raised **within 15 minutes of decision**, after which no protest will be entertained.
- 11.3 An individual or team may protest against another individual or team **within 15 minutes of published results** to the organiser.
- 11.4 All protests must be submitted with a protest form with supporting evidence in the form of photographs, video or independent witness statement(s).
- 11.5 To avoid frivolous claims, all protests must be accompanied with a **protest fee of BND200**. Should the protest be bonafide with supporting evidence and accepted by organisers and commissaire, the fee will be returned and results updated.
- 11.6 Cycling safety is everyone's responsibility. All applicable rules for participation must be followed and that **SOLE RESPONSIBILITY FOR PERSONAL SAFETY REMAINS WITH** the individual rider, including any physical and emotional preparation and fitness to participate in all events and programs throughout the year.
- 11.7 Riders accept these risks, and all others arising from these events and programs, even if arising from the **NEGLIGENCE, GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR NEGLIGENT RESCUE** by BDCF and/or its agent, those associated in any way with the BDCF events and programs that they may be involved in, the venues at which these events and programs takes place or by those organizing, officiating, or participating in these events and programs throughout the year, including their respective officers, committee members, directors, employees, agents, servants, volunteers, members and representatives (the Releasees).
- 11.8 Riders may undertake and agree to remove themselves from participation if they sense or observe any unusual hazard or unsafe condition, or if, at any time, at any event or program, they feel unable or unfit to safely continue for any reason.
- 11.9 Riders gives **FULL RELEASE, AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND ALL CLAIMS** that they have, or may have in the future, against the BDCF and/or its agents, and all other Releasees from all liability for any loss damage, injury or expense that they may suffer as a result of participation in any part or parts of the events

or programs or presence at any venue at which they may take place, due to any cause whatsoever including the forms of negligence set forth in paragraph 11.7 above or from any breach of contract or statutory duty or other duty of care including any duty of care owed on the part of the Releasees.

- 11.10 Any form of gambling or betting is strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification and bans from future races organised by BDCF and/or its agents.

12 Team event

- 12.1 All team members are required to register as individuals first and to indicate that they will be part of a team.
- 12.2 Only riders registered to race 120km will be eligible to be part of a team. Each team must at least have two (2) riders in the Masters category.
- 12.3 Number of riders per team is a minimum of four (4) riders and maximum of five (5) riders. To determine ranking for general team classification, each team must have a minimum of four (4) riders to finish. Minimum two (2) riders in the Masters category must finish.
- 12.4 Team category will proceed if more than 10 teams registered.
- 12.5 Numbers of categories in a team are not restricted.
- 12.6 Every rider in each team is qualified to win the individual title of respective category.
- 12.7 Clubs or teams may register more than one team. However, each team within the same club must produce distinctively different official jerseys.
- 12.8 Riders confirmed as starters at the team managers meeting can no longer be substituted.
- 12.9 Teams must produce official team jerseys to be approved at the managers meeting during pre-race briefing.
- 12.10 All riders in the team must be Brunei residents holding Yellow, Red or Green Identity Card.
- 12.11 Each team must have only one (1) team car. Team vehicle must not be higher than 1.6m and no diesel fueled vehicles are allowed.
- 12.12 BDCF reserves the right to amend any regulation where necessary without prior notice to the teams

13 Racing procedures

- 13.1 Cut-off time - there will be a cut-off time of 4 hours after the start of the race or 25% from the time of first rider to finish the race, whichever comes first. Broom

wagon will advise riders that may finish beyond cut-off time to stop. Riders wishing to continue may do so at their own risk.

- 13.2 A rider dropping out of the race shall immediately remove his body number and hand it in to a commissaire or to the broom wagon. He may not cross the finish line. Unless he is injured or feels seriously sick, he must travel in the broom wagon.
- 13.3 There will be a rolling start of at least 10km. The exact distance will be published together with the official race route.
- 13.4 **Safety is an important aspect. The roads will not be closed completely, riders are advised to adhere to road rules.** Riders dropped from peloton or lone riders must use as much as possible the hard shoulder and inner lane. It is up to cyclists to **project a good image to all road users.**
- 13.5 For increased awareness to fellow riders within peloton and other road users, usage of ear-piece or any device that is considered a distraction and may lessen hearing is strictly prohibited.
- 13.6 Riders are not allowed to use Pro-Team or World Tour Team jerseys to avoid any copyright infringement.
- 13.7 Feeding is allowed after 40km from start and before 10km to finish.
- 13.8 There will be three (3) static feeding zones along the route. After which a waste zone will be established.
- 13.9 Static feeding zones and waste zones will be informed to all during pre-race briefing. If you are not confident, riders are advised to stop then take the feeding.
- 13.10 For teams, the food and drink shall be distributed on foot by the support staff accompanying the team and by no-one else. Staff supplying the riders must wear team's clothing and stand at a maximum of one meter from the side of the road. They shall be positioned on one side of the road only, which must be the side on which road traffic circulates.
- 13.11 All feeding (from a car or on foot outside of the feeding zones - refer 13.7) is strictly forbidden.
- 13.12 The rider must safely and exclusively deposit their waste on the sides of the road in the waste zone area. It is forbidden to carry and/or use glass objects.
- 13.13 BDCF adopts a **no littering policy** - riders or teams found to litter plastic bottles or power gel packets or equivalent outside the waste zone will be PENALISED. **A penalty of BND50 will be charged to the individual rider or team.**

- 13.14 Team Car Drivers (of both cars and motorcycles) must respect the relevant provisions of the Brunei Road Traffic Regulations and other relevant law and shall:
- ensure that their vehicle is in good condition and roadworthy;
 - ensure that they are fit to drive and not impaired in any way, for example by fatigue or the consumption of alcohol, drugs, medication or any other substances that may influence driving skills;
 - drive in a prudent manner to safeguard the safety of riders in the race, spectators and other vehicles;
 - withhold from undertaking any action likely to distract their attention from the road and traffic.
 - hold a valid driving license
- 13.15 Team Car Drivers must also comply with instructions given to them by race commissaires, the race organiser and with any relevant rules or guidelines issued by the UCI.
- 13.16 Team Car Drivers must never allow riders to hold onto their vehicle and pass a barrage without prior permission from a commissaire.
- 13.17 All riders may render each other such minor services as lending or exchanging food, drink, spanners or accessories.
- 13.18 The lending or exchanging of tubular tyres or bicycles and waiting for a rider who has been dropped or involved in an accident shall be permitted only amongst riders of the same team.
- 13.19 The pushing of one rider by another shall in all cases be forbidden, on pain of disqualification.
- 13.20 Riders are prohibited to hold on to their team car, be assisted or pushed by the team car or to draft behind the team car.

14 Equipment

- 14.1 All riders must wear a cycling helmet and attire and must ensure everything is appropriate and safe for the race.
- 14.2 Bicycles used must be UCI standard and approved for use during races:
- For the Road Bike category, bicycles used must be standard racing road bike. All other types of bikes such as folding bike, hybrid bike or fixie bikes are not allowed.
 - For the Mountain Bike category, front suspension is mandatory. Mountain bikes with rigid fork and fatbike are not allowed. Mountain bike tyre width should not be less than 1.9 inches.
- 14.3 Equipment checks will be performed during race sign in by commissaire.

15 Updates
